- A woman was seriously injured when a vehicle entered a parking lot from Turner Street, striking her as she stood in a parking lot. The investigation is continuing.

- The annual National Night Out event coordinated by Investigator Tony Stevens was held at the Municipal Park with great success.
- Canine Hugo was laid to rest after a sudden and unexpected illness cut short his life. Hugo served the citizens of our nation with the U.S. Army in Afghanistan and the citizens of Bethlehem Township for the past three years. Hugo was six and one half years old.

- The physical agility portion of the patrol testing procedure was held at Moravian College.
