### ZONING HEARING BOARD MEETING OF OCTOBER 29, 2025

The following appeals are on the agenda:

Appeal 17-2025 – Ann Gillette / 4002 Tamarind Drive – Dimensional variance request to erect an elevated deck in the rear of the property. Seeking relief from setback requirement for a principal structure from the rear property line.

Appeal 18-2025 – TSV-HPIII Lehigh Valley, LLC / 3311 Farmersville Road (MOB) – Seeking 3 dimensional variances from streetscape requirements. First is a variance request for the setback distance of the street edge wall to the right-of-way (this is the variance request for the retaining wall along Farmersville Road). The other two variance requests are related to street trees. Applicant is requesting to be able to place trees at irregular intervals instead of 1 for every 50 feet of frontage.

Upon motion (Deckman-Gallagher), the Board of Commissioners voted unanimously by voice vote directing the solicitor to attend the meeting and advise staff as necessary. Ms. Lawrence and Mr. Hudak were absent.

#### **DISCUSSION ITEM**

BETHLEHEM AREA VOCATIONAL TECHNICAL SCHOOL PROPOSAL TO MAKE REPAIRS TO THE STONE WALLS, STEPS AND FOUNTAIN LOCATED NEAR THE JOHNSTON MANSION IN HOUSENICK MEMORIAL PARK

Mr. Gallagher said the ARCHIE Project has been working closely with the Vo-Tech school. The students did a great job of pruning around the property and were interested in doing more work including the fountain. He said the cost is minimal at just under \$2,000 and is a benefit to the township and the park. Mr. Merhottein agreed. Mr. Gallagher said the Vo-Tech is having an Open House on Wednesday, October 22, and invited the board to see the amazing work the students do.

Upon motion (Gallagher-Merhottein), the Board of Commissioners voted unanimously by voice vote to prepare the necessary agreements to work with and allow the Bethlehem Area Vo-Tech to make repairs to the stone walls, steps and fountain located near the Johnston mansion in Housenick Memorial Park. Ms. Lawrence and Mr. Hudak were absent.
